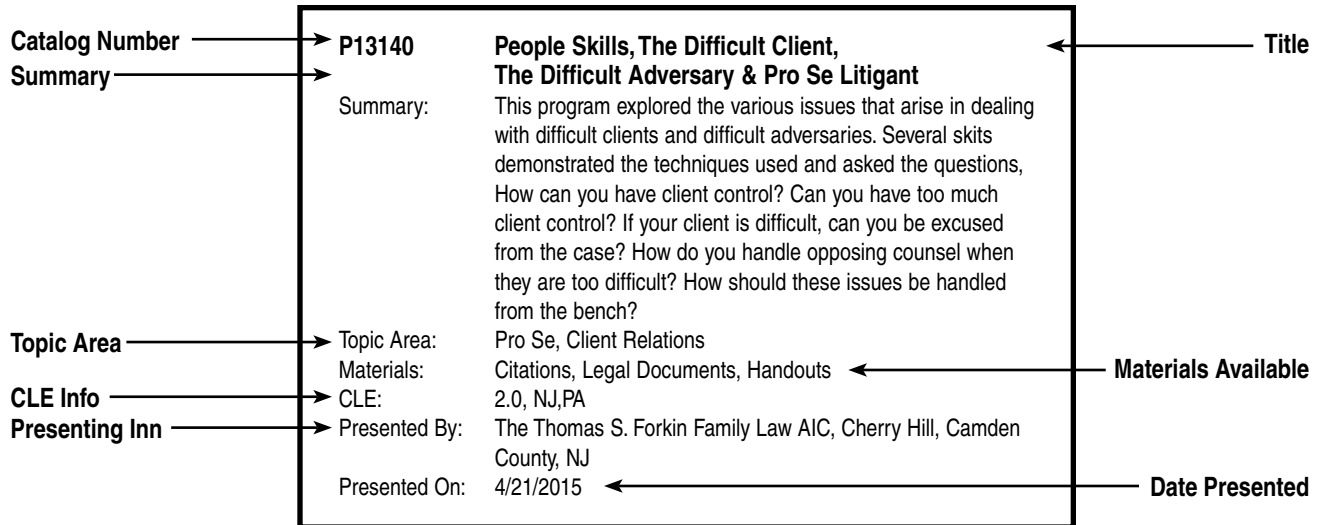

How to Download Programs from the American Inns of Court Website www.innsofcourt.org

Programs can be downloaded directly from the website. The only items that a member cannot download are videos and DVDs that accompany some programs, those items can be shipped to the Inn member directly. Here are some quick instructions for how to download a program from our website.

1. Login to the website. To search the online Program Library, to order programs online, or to download programs to your computer, you must first login to the American Inns of Court website, at www.innsofcourt.org. To login to the website, click "Sign In" at the top of the screen. Enter your e-mail address and password.

2. Navigate to the "For Members" tab and click "Program Library" on the left side.

3. Search through the Program Library. You can search the Program Library by entering a topic search term in the available text box or by selecting an item from the Spotlight! or featured topic areas on the right.

4. Add the program to your cart. If one of the programs suits your needs, you can add it to your shopping cart by clicking on the "Add to Cart" button next to the program.

5. Check out. Once you have clicked "Check Out" you will receive an automatic "Inns of Court Order Summary" e-mail in your inbox. This e-mail will have links to download each of the programs you ordered.

6. Download your program. You can click on any one of the links and save the program to your desktop or to another folder. After that, you can review the program at your leisure and as often as you like. You can also print out copies of the programs you ordered.

Note: Programs with DVDs or other electronic media are not immediately available for download. These programs have a \$10.00 fee and will be mailed.

First Place

Benching the Bench:

Your Honor, May We Reproach? (P12962)

The Anthony M. Kennedy AIC—Sacramento, CA

The program focuses on the conduct of judges and how attorneys may respond to perceived problems with the bench officer. The program uses humor to address issues between judges and attorneys that are often overlooked during Inn presentations.

Second Place

Ethics Are Forever:

What if James Bond Was a Client? (P12863)

The Craig S. Barnard AIC—West Palm Beach, FL

Using a James Bond theme, this program discussed issues of client confidentiality and when to withdraw when client interests put an attorney in danger. After a skit, Inn members were quizzed in a *Family Feud*-style game on the ethical issues presented.

Third Place

Evidence: Chain of Custody (P13016)

The Vassar B. Carlton AIC—Melbourne, FL

This program incorporated various media formats with live skits and group discussion to give an entertaining presentation on many different forms of technology and digital media, including e-mail, computer hard drives, letters, text messages, social media video surveillance, and audio recordings that parties may wish to admit into evidence and the complexities (and pitfalls) of establishing a good chain of custody.

Best Special Project

Cyber Carta, Magna Carta for the Information Age

(P13224)

The Temple AIC—Philadelphia, PA

This program demonstrated how the concepts of protecting the rights of the people and limiting the power of government inherent in Magna Carta formed the foundation of Constitutional government in the United States. The video focused on the contemporary impact of Magna Carta on expectations for individual liberties and self-government.

Outstanding Programs

Lost in Spoliation:

Practical Implications and Ethics Considerations When Evidence Goes Missing (P12854)

The AIC of Acadiana—Lafayette, LA

This program explored the loss, alteration, and destruction of evidence through intentional misconduct, negligence, or something in between. In addition to addressing the basics of spoliation, the program discussed unique ethics concerns pertinent to the loss and destruction of evidence. Vignettes demonstrated these principles, and five song parodies highlighted things that are lost or missing, such as “You’ve Lost That Loving Feeling” and “Fifty Ways to Leave Your Lover”.

Willie Wonka and the Conflict Factory (P12859)

The Benjamin Harrison AIC—Fort Wayne, IN

With the unexpected folding of Wonka’s long-term law firm Hornswaggler, Snozzwangler, and Whangdoodle, LLP, Charlie Bucket and four other lucky attorneys received golden tickets to bid on the elusive Wonka’s legal work. Questions arose about the various conflicts of interest faced by each of the lawyers who received a golden ticket.

Oh Shake-scene!!! (P12881)

The Charles Clark AIC—Jackson, MS

Inspired by a slander suit filed in 1593, this program addressed issues of professional ethics, procedure, evidence, defamation, and separation of powers. The trial reenactment shed light on the identity of the author of the first published statement about Shakespeare as a playwright and the impetus for the unprecedented retraction of the same statement.

Inn-side the Actor’s Studio:

Murder Mystery Edition (P12963)

The Craig S. Barnard AIC—West Palm Beach, FL

In this presentation, the pupillage group used the format of *Inside the Actor’s Studio* to discuss legal and ethics issues facing lawyers, such as trial practice, discovery, communication with clients, and witness preparation.

How Prepared Are You

to Face a Judicial Shark Tank? (P12973)

The Villanova Law J. Willard O’Brien AIC—Villanova, PA

This program explored how to communicate effectively with the court while maintaining professional civility. Based upon the hit television show *Shark Tank*, the presentation portrayed attorneys attempting to convince judges to buy their arguments.

The Digital Lives of Jurors:**What Is a Lawyer To Do?** (P12982)*The William B. Bryant AIC—Washington, DC*

The program examined the ethics and practicalities of investigating jurors online against the backdrop of the 1976 Patty Hearst trial with a modern day social media twist. The program considers the recent ethics opinion issued by the ABA Standing Committee on Ethics and Professionalism, which says that simply observing information a juror or potential juror has posted publicly online is not improper. How do you prepare for jury selection? What do you do if you discover that one of the jurors has “favorited” Hearst’s tweet?

Money, Money, Money (P12983)*The Judge Consuelo M. Callahan AIC—Stockton, CA*

This program topic dealt with attorney fees. The two Act skit used well-known celebrities to discuss the issues involved with collecting payment and all the steps in between.

Write to Be Heard (P12998)*The Garland R. Walker AIC, Houston, TX*

This creative program was designed to take the often construed dull topic of effective legal writing and present it in an entertaining and educational manner. The program employed alternating multimedia formats, including video interviews with attorneys, historic reenactment, a short skit, and a panel discussion with active judges. Content focused on great legal writers for the Supreme Court of the United States and what made their writing great, the elements for effective writing from the perspective of local attorneys recognized in the community as good writers, and professionalism in legal writing. Program content combined perspectives and pointers from both historical and current sources.

Mystery Dinner Theater:**Mystery on the High Speed Rail** (P13006)*The Craig S. Barnard AIC—West Palm Beach, FL*

This program was part play and musical comedy. Characters discussed their lawyers and impressions of them based on advertising and behavior. The presentation focused on the public’s impressions of attorney advertising, client conflicts of interest, and the judiciary. The setting for the play was the proposed high-speed rail from West Palm Beach to Orlando. The characters were attorneys and members of the general public, interacting in the closed quarters of a dining car. The characters playing attorneys confronted former clients and acquaintances, and answered questions about various ethics dilemmas. Audience members gave their input, discussing the issues presented and how the issues should be addressed. The thrilling conclusion showed how small the local legal community really is and tied everything together in classic murder-mystery style.

Notes on a Scandal:**Employing the Best Legal and Ethics Practices When Assisting Clients in a Crisis** (P13014)*The Temple AIC—Philadelphia, PA*

The program addressed the legal, ethical, and practical considerations of crisis management. Using a video reel of contemporary examples of crisis management as an introduction, it explored the topic using both video and live vignettes that addressed a variety of appropriate responses in times of crisis.

Law Is King: Garland R. Walker Inn’s Most Excellent Magna Carta Adventure (800 Years of the Rule of Law!) (P13070)*The Garland R. Walker AIC—Houston, TX*

This winning program of the 2015 Magna Carta Program Contest used a wide variety of presentations to educate, entertain, and enlighten a large audience in a multi-layered play with more than 30 cast members, which featured original songs and a humorous presentation of life in the days leading up to and during Magna Carta’s inception. Also included were a trivia challenge, reverse mentoring, historic document preservation, and pro bono volunteer opportunities.

The Games People Play (P13097)*The Consuelo M. Callahan AIC—Stockton, CA*

This program centered on themes of client and attorney competency. Using the classic Monopoly game, the presentation depicted an aging real estate tycoon meeting his new attorney for the first time to discuss his estate planning needs. The program explored the questionable decision making skills/mental competency of the client and how it related to the case and all parties involved.

Treble Damage: Ethics Revue 2015 (P13118)*The Colorado Intellectual Property AIC—Denver, CO*

The presentation addressed ethics in the legal profession. Through a series of songs and scripted dialogues, the presenters sang about and discussed common ethics issues faced by intellectual property attorneys. The issues were presented from the perspective of new associates being guided by seasoned partners, and included civility in the courtroom, witness coaching, redactions, the use of marijuana, intellectual property protection of marijuana-related products and business, and sanctions with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. The presentation featured 12 performers who sang, performed, and played instruments while providing messages about what civility means in the legal profession, the importance of civility, and how to maintain civility in day-to-day practice.

- P12610** **The Negative Impact of Criminal Law Practice**
 Summary: This program highlighted dealing with difficult criminal clients. A veteran prosecutor and a veteran trial attorney related their trial experiences and showed a video that depicted aspects of criminal law. The program concluded with group discussion as participants shared their experiences with difficult clients.
